

NATIONAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING RESOURCE CENTER (NHTRC) DATA BREAKDOWN

Human Trafficking of Males 1/1/2015 - 12/31/2015

SUBSTANTIVE CALL DATA

During the period between January 1, 2015 and December 31, 2015, a total of **5,963 substantive calls** were made to the NHTRC hotline by males. Substantive calls exclude hang-ups, wrong numbers, declined calls, missed calls, and calls in which the NHTRC could not determine the caller's reason for calling. The following information is based on these 5,963 calls.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING CASE DATA

Between January 1, 2015 and December 31, 2015, the NHTRC hotline received reports of 5,526 potential human trafficking cases in the United States. A case corresponds to an incident of human trafficking. Each case may contain multiple calls about a single incident of human trafficking. **573 (10.4%) of these cases (incidents) involved males**. The following information is based on these 573 cases.


